### Ohio State Tests Spring 2018 Administration

The schedule for achievement assessment weeks is listed in the Calendar of Events section of the Navigator. In order to provide the best opportunity for your child during this assessment period, we ask the following:

- ◆ Students arrive each assessment day on time.
- ◆ Appointments should not be scheduled on a day that your child is scheduled to take an assessment.
- ◆ Students should get up in time to have breakfast either at home or at school on assessment days.
- ◆ Students should have plenty of rest the night before an assessment.

### Dismissal Changes

Parents are reminded not to call the school to make changes in your child's dismissal.

A child should know how they are going home when they come to school. Any changes to a child's normal dismissal can be confusing to your child and to the school, unless it is sent in writing and explained to your child in the morning.

## Open Enrollment

If you currently attend Geneva Area City Schools as an open enrollment student or know someone who does, please be sure to complete an application online and submit it by May 31, 2018. The open enrollment period runs May 1-31 each year. Please be sure to provide proof of residency (utility bill, lease agreement, etc) even if you have attended Geneva Area City Schools this school year.

## Ways Parents Can Promote Reading at Home

1. Read yourself. Children see you read and want to read.
2. Make sure your children read every day.
3. Get in the library habit. Make sure everyone in your family has a library card. Schedule regular trips to the library. While you are there, check out a book yourself!
4. Read aloud to your children.
5. Make sure your child has access to a variety of books.
6. Give books as gifts. Then find a special place for your children to keep their own library.
7. Make reading a privilege. Say, "You can stay up 15 minutes later tonight if you read in bed." Or you might say, "Because you helped with the dishes, I have time to read you an extra story."
8. If you are not a good reader, you can still encourage your children. As your children learn to read, ask them to read to you. Talk about the books read. Ask a friend or relative to read aloud to your children.
