

Auto skills competition

The competition is cosponsored by AAA and Ford Motor Company. Its objective is to encourage talented young people to pursue careers as automotive service technicians.

How the Competition Works

This is a nationwide competition for 11th and 12th grade students in secondary schools and colleges (serving local high schools) that offer courses in automotive technology and have at least one full-time or part-time automotive instructor.

Schools may enter one team per instructor (minimum 2 students) of 11th and 12th grader students. Each instructor must apply individually.

Each participating instructor selects his best 11th or 12th grade auto technology students to take the state qualifying exam which is taken on line and administered by a test administrator at the school.

The combined score of the two highest scoring students from each school becomes the team score and counts 40% in the state finals.
