Grading

Grades are based on semesters. The grade point average is computed for all subjects on a 4.0 scale. Weighted grades are given for advanced placement courses by adding 0.50 quality point. Students who have earned a 3.50 or better are placed on the Honor Roll. Students who have earned 3.0-3.49 for each nine weeks are placed on the Merit Roll.

Program of Studies

Advanced Placement: Highly challenging courses with expectations that students will work independently and demonstrate high levels of critical and analytical thinking, reading and writing.

College Preparatory: Courses which demand high levels of cognitive and problem solving processes. A rigorous instructional pace allows for both curricular depth and enrichment.

Regular: Courses that provide instruction to develop skills in reading and writing, computation, reasoning and higher level thinking.

These courses ready students for college work as well as other postsecondary ventures.

Vocational: Courses in Career Based Intervention are available for at-risk students. Basic study skills and exposure to the world of work are presented to students enrolled in these classes.
